

## **2022 Camp Health and Safety Guidelines**

Hosting camp programming during a pandemic is a decision Lakeside is proud to make. We believe the benefits of camp are worth the risks. By sending a camper to Lakeside you understand there is a risk for exposure or contracting Covid19. Safety is our number one priority and we are taking the following precautions to limit the spread of the virus. These safety guidelines are put in place to protect your camper, other campers, the staff, and our local community. We have many safety guidelines at camp and expect everyone to follow all safety guidelines. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.

We will continue to monitor local, state and national guidelines. If needed we will update these guidelines accordingly. The most up to date guidelines will be posted on our website and sent in pre-camp communications via email.

### **Staff**

Vaccinations:

- Strongly recommended to be vaccinated from Covid19
  - If NOT vaccinated they will be required to take regular tests before campers arrive.

While at camp:

- Known Exposure-
  - Vaccinated- Will monitor for symptoms for 10 days after exposure.
  - Unvaccinated- Will mask and monitor for symptoms for 10 days. Will get a test 5 days after exposure.
- Showing Symptoms - Will get a test and mask around others, quarantine as able.
- Positive Test- Staff will be quarantined immediately. If possible they will be relocated to their home with family to care for them. Quarantine will remain in effect until 5 days after positive test results and 24 hours symptom free. If anytime arises that quarantine is not possible masking will be required for positive individuals.

### **Campers (Includes volunteers, adult leaders, and adult campers)**

Before Camp

- Strongly recommended to be vaccinated from Covid19 with an updated booster
  - If NOT vaccinated we ask that campers practice social distancing or use a mask when in public for 10 days prior to camp.
- Upon arriving at camp, vaccinated campers are asked to show an updated Covid19 vaccination record.
- We ask that all campers are symptom free for at least 10 days prior to coming to Lakeside and have no known exposure to Covid19.
  - If vaccinated and exposed a camper can attend if they are symptom free and we will monitor for symptoms after arrival.
- If a camper can not attend camp due to symptoms or exposure they can attend a different week or will receive a full refund.

### While at Camp:

- If a camper finds out they were exposed prior to arrival
  - Vaccinated: Monitor for symptoms
  - Unvaccinated: Required to mask indoors, and monitor for symptoms
- If symptoms develop: Get a Covid19 Test, mask, and social distance from other campers. If a rapid test is not available at camp, the camper will go to the clinic and this would be on their insurance like any other medical visit a camper would have.
- Positive Test will result in the camper being sent home. No refunds will be given.

### Daily Mitigation Efforts:

- Outdoors- We will spend as much time outdoors as possible.
- Social distancing- We are fortunate to have lots of space at camp. We will intentionally lead activities in a way that does not require lots of close personal contact with non-cabin members. This has always been a practice at camp personal space and boundaries also help stop the spread of Covid19.
- Indoors
  - Meals are served indoors, we will use social distancing in line. We will space tables out. If needed some cabins will eat on picnic tables on the deck.
  - Rainy day activities will be held in the barn, canteen, cabins, boat house, and event center. We will practice social distancing.
  - Severe Weather Warnings result in campers going to the storm shelter. There are 3 storm shelters onsite. If social distancing is not possible in these areas, masks will be required by everyone in that space. Masks will be provided. This is the only situation where we will require masks.

### After departing Camp

- If a camper tests positive less than 10 days after leaving camp, please notify the office.
- If we find out your camper was exposed while at camp we will notify you.
  - Exposure would be anyone in the same cabin group as an infected individual.

### Symptoms include the following:

- Fever of 101 or higher
- New or worsening cough
- Vomiting or Diarrhea
- Loss of Taste or Smell
