Position Summary

All (4) Assistant Program Directors (APD) plan, coordinate, and implement each week of summer programming in conjunction with the Program Director. Together they are responsible for guiding, leading, encouraging, and supervising the rest of the summer staff. Each APD is assigned areas of management that they have interest and skills in. These areas include worship, adventure, waterfront, medical, camp store, media, crafts, games, and environmental education.

Assistant Program Directors also help maintain the safety and supervision of the campers on site. They are problem-solvers, behind-the-scenes workers, and key leaders of Lutheran Lakeside Camp.
